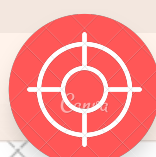
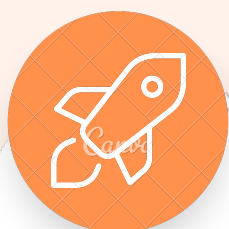


CHARACTERISTICS OF RADONDA VAUGHT'S TRIAL
